The first television set in Santa Clara, to my knowledge, was purchased by Verl (Si) Graf. He lived in the house just across Highway 91 from the Santa Clara Church, on the southwest corner.

Si was very patient, and willing to let people crowd into his small home to get a look at the newest invention, finally arrived in our small town. The year must have been in the mid-1950s, maybe 1955 or 1956.

I vividly remember the day I knocked on the door to ask if I could see the television--I was probably 7 or 8 years old. I was invited in, and sat down on the floor to look at the TV, which displayed a very snowy test pattern because nothing was being broadcast at the time. This is similar to how it
